CAMBRIDGE PRIMARY CHECKPOINT 2017

The Cambridge Primary Checkpoint tests take place every year for students studying in Grade 6, conducted by the Cambridge International Examinations, UK. These tests assess a student's knowledge in three subjects, namely English, Mathematics and Science, each being allocated a total mark range of 6 points.

The results this year have been immensely heartening. The students, with the help of their teachers and their meticulous work have acquired extraordinary results to their merit. A total of thirty six students from Good Shepherd International School appeared for the examination in April 2017. Keeping in mind the arduous nature of the exam and the amount of effort that has gone in during preparations, it is quite a matter of achievement that four of our students – Pratham Lingadalli, Siddh Kekin Dedhia, Rohan Ramesh and Rishi Rohith V. Guna – have stood first with an aggregate of 100%, acquiring full six points in all three subjects. Many of our students have also acquired excellent individual subject results. While English had four student toppers, Mathematics and Science had ten and eleven six pointers respectively.

CAMBRIDGE CHECKPOINT (SECONDARY 1)

The Cambridge Secondary 1 Checkpoint for Grade 8 students was held on 17, 18 and 19 April, 2017 for the subjects: English, Mathematics and Science, respectively. Each subject contributes equally with 6 points towards a total score of 18.

A total of 77 students sat for the examinations and the highest scorers, Aashish Prakash Parmar and M K Pritesh scored the near perfect score of 17.9 out of a possible maximum of 18. Although the maximum perfect scores lay with Mathematics, Science had its strength in numbers in the near perfect scores and English saw improvement in its average scorers, with

Aashish Prakash Parmar scoring the perfect score of 6 in English and Mathematics. He shared the position with M K Pritesh who scored a perfect 6 in Mathematics and Science. Armaan Jain bagged the second position with 17.3 overall and perfect scores of 6 in Mathematics and Science. Hemang Arora stood third with 17 points and a perfect score of 6 in Mathematics. Honourable mentions include, Sakshi Chintanbhai Vaghani, Mayanka Agarwal and Nabeeha Mahanta, all of which scored a 6 and 5 and above in other subjects. The results reinforce our belief in hard work and continued commitment to excellence. Congratulations to the students and staff !
