Yes, we did it again but far better than in the past! Not rigorous in intake, keeping by the word of raising the bar and pursuing excellence, GSIS once again ensured that students who came with average caliber ended up scoring 6s and 7s in many subjects.

32 candidates took the board examination this year and 30 got a diploma. The school average is 34 points and the average point scored in each subject is 5.40 out of 7

17 students scored above 35 points and there were 18 7s overall, that is, of the 16 subjects all except three had students scoring 7. 9 students scored an A in Extended Essay and 6 students scored a full 3 points in the TOK/EE combination. Only five 3s were scored overall and nobody had scored below that. Needless to say, in almost all the subjects the school average was higher than the world average.

The top scorer, Anjali Sabu Nair scored 41 points and an A in her mathematics Extended Essay. The three subjects taken for the first time, Design Technology, Spanish and Visual Arts proved to be highly successful as the students scored well in them.

The results are a proof that we, at Good Shepherd International School believe in bringing out better than the best in each child and ensure that he or she is able to make a significant mark in the world, emerging as great leaders and good citizens of the world.
